



Covenant of Mayors for Climate & Energy Mediterranean Letter of Intent of Tamar Regional Council - Dead Sea

Dear Covenant of Mayors Office in the Mediterranean,

I, Nir Vanger, the mayor of Tamar Regional Council - Dead Sea, have been mandated by the Municipal Council on June 27 2021 to declare the commitment of the Tamar Regional Council - Dead Sea to join the Covenant of Mayors for Climate & Energy in the Mediterranean (CoM Med).

Local authorities are faced with growing challenges as regards the satisfaction of their citizens', as well as their buildings/ facilities' energy needs in a sustainable way. The municipalities' aim to join the Covenant of Mayors Mediterranean is providing improved services and better quality of life to the citizens and mitigating / adapting to the adverse impacts of climate change in their region in the long-term horizon.

I recognise that a commitment to the Covenant of Mayors Mediterranean, CoM Med requires a pledge to implement policies and undertake measures to (i) reduce (or limit where relevant) greenhouse gas emissions, (ii) prepare for the impacts of climate change, (iii) increase access to sustainable energy, and (iv) track progress toward these objectives. Specifically, within no more than 3 years of the present commitment the Tamar Regional Council - Dead Sea will develop and report on the following:

- A municipal-scale greenhouse gas emission inventory and an assessment of climate hazards and vulnerabilities;
- Ambitious, measurable and time-bound target(s) to reduce/limit greenhouse gas emissions;
- Ambitious adaptation vision and goals, based on quantified scientific evidence when possible, to increase local resilience to climate change
- Ambitious and just goal to improve access to affordable sustainable energy; and
- Plan(s) to address climate change mitigation, adaptation, and sustainable energy access, including provisions for regular (annual or biennial) evaluation and revisions.

The quantified targets and action plans will be consistent with or exceed relevant national commitments defined through the UNFCCC (Intended) Nationally Determined Contribution.

I acknowledge that participation in the CoM Med is contingent on complying with the above.
